ii3 Autism (without intellectual disability) Classification Process

This information provides details on how students can be classified for ii3 Autism (without an intellectual disability).

How to apply for Classification with Sports Inclusion Australia (SIA)

Autism Classification requires a formal diagnosis:

- A formal diagnosis of autism (ASD) carried out by a qualified practitioner using accepted diagnostic techniques (see guidance notes from SIA [here](#)) plus a full scale IQ of 76 or above.
- Evidence must be submitted to Sports Inclusion Australia (SIA).
- The ii3 (Autism) eligibility application form can be found in the School Sport Eligibility section and [here](#). The registration fee is \$25.

Timeline - allow 8-12 weeks. Evidence is reviewed and then once deemed eligible, students will be given an SIA number and an identification card with photo and classification, which will last until they are 18 years old.

Next steps: Notify your school of the classification for them to enter the student into School Sport Victoria events.

SSV ii3 Trial 2024

Due to the length of time an ii3 classification can take, SSV will accept entries from ii3 class students if their application for classification has been submitted to Sport Inclusion Australia
