

HUME REGION primary & secondary cross country championships wednesday 21 june 2017 Winton Motor Raceway

Winton – Benalla Road

ELIGIBILTY

Competing athletes including athletes with a disability are those nominated by the SSV Divisions of Hume Region

In the 12/13 to 17/20 events each SSV Secondary Division in each race will enter the top 10 individual runners plus a team of 5 runners from one school. All team members are also entered in the individual competition.

In 9/10 to 12/13 events, each SSV Primary Division in each race will enter a maximum of 15 individuals.

12/13 PRIM = 12/13 Primary students

ie students must be turning 12 or 13 in the year of competition, attend a Full or Associate member Primary School and competed in the 12/13 Primary race at Division level.

12/13 SEC = 12/13 Secondary students

ie students must be turning 12 or 13 in the year of competition, attend a Full or Associate member Secondary School and competed in the 12/13 Secondary race at Division level

Entries: Once all Division entries have been received they will be posted on the SSV/ Hume Region/Cross Country web Page.

All schools and entrants are asked to check that their entry has been correctly posted and to notify the convener of any errors as early as possible.

Invitations

Schools may apply for an invitation for competitors provided they meet the eligibility clause(s) which can be found on the SSV website / forms / invitation request form. The invitation request must be E Mailed the relevant Hume Region Co-ordinator before Wednesday 15 June 2017.

Athletes with a Disability

Events for athletes with a disability (excluding wheelchair athletes) will be conducted concurrently with the following events:

Girls 9-13 Multi Class (MC) Primary with Girls 9/10 Years:

Boys 9-13 Para Multi Class (MC) with Boys 9/10 Years

Girls 12-20 Multi Class (MC) Secondary with Girls 14 Years:

Boys 12-20 Multi Class (MC) Secondary with Boys 14 Years

Each Multi Class competitor MUST have competed at the Division level.

MC events will be conducted using the multi disability format for both boys and girls and results calculated using the Athletics Australia Multi Disability Standards (MDS) tables.

Students must hold a current classification. Students without a classification must contact the Australian Paralympic Committee (see contact details on the SSV website)

Race numbers

All students will be issued with a 3 digit race code number which must be written in permanent marker on the **outside of the RIGHT forearm**. The numbers need to be clear and approximately 5cm in height. Schools are responsible for writing the number on the competitor **<u>BEFORE</u>** arriving at Winton

The numbers are listed in the race entries attachment.

Protests & Corrections

Protests concerning the conduct of an event must be lodged orally with the Referee immediately an issue/concern arises.

After the Referee has made his/her decision, there is an opportunity to lodge an appeal in writing with the convener. There is an appeal fee of AUD\$50 cash to accompany any appeal. Presentations will be withheld whilst any protest or appeal is being heard.

Results will be posted as soon as all entries are collated at the conclusion of each event, together with the time they are posted.

There will be a ten minute opportunity for protests over results or corrections to be lodged with the convener.

After 10 minutes, if there are no protests or appeals of any kind or corrections, presentations will be made to the individuals and team place-getters.

Protests received after this 10 minutes period has elapsed and presentations have been made will not be heard.

Pets

Dogs are not welcome at the venue

Privacy

The names and schools of all entrants, plus full results, will be published on the School Sport Victoria web site. If you wish your name (or your child's name) to be withheld, please contact the convener.

Dress

Students must wear appropriate athletic uniform.

Spiked footwear, football boots and other cleated footwear is <u>NOT</u> permitted.

Competitors not correctly dressed will not be permitted to compete.

Warming Up

Warming up is NOT permitted on the course. Walking the course prior to the start of competition is permitted

<u>Rules</u>

Ages are calculated as at December 31, 2017. Competing athletes may compete in only one age group for which they are eligible.

Athletes turning 8 years of age in the year of competition are <u>not</u> eligible to compete in the 9/10 Years events.

The course will be marked with flags and cones. Officials will be located at various points around the course. The course is subject to alteration at any time.

IAAF Rules only allow an athlete to carry a watch and/or a 'Ventolin' inhaler. Athletes being paced are subject to disqualification.

Disqualifications

Checkpoint officials will refer any competitor to the referee who deviate from the course to gain an advantage or who are not putting in a reasonable effort (who are walking) or who are being 'paced' by a coach/spectator.

<u>Shelter</u>

There is very little shelter at the venue. Schools are encouraged to bring their own shelter.

Bus and car parking

There is ample parking at Winton. Please follow the directions of the parking attendants.

First Aid

Qualified first aid personnel will be in attendance

Food and Drink

The facility will provide

Hot food, Drinks and sweets, Expresso Coffee machine

Presentations

Presentations will be made to the winning and runner up team and first 3 individual place getters 10 minutes after the conclusion of the event. Information will be given to SSV Cross Country qualifiers. All entry lists and final results will be posted on the wall of the presentation shelter.

SSV Qualification

In 12/13 Secondary Years, 14 Years, 15 Years, 16 Years and 17-20 Years events each SSV Region, in each race, will enter a team of 5 runners from one school plus a further 7 Individuals. All team members are also entered in the individual competition. In the 17-20 Team event, all 4 team runners must place in the top 50% of placegetters for the winning team to qualify for the SSV championships. If there is no qualifying team 12 individuals will qualify.

For the 9/10 Years, 11 Years and 12/13 Primary Years events, each SSV Region, in each race, will enter 12 individuals.
