Schools need to provide

- Bibs with netball positions, two sets the same is preferred
- Size 5 netball for matches
- First aid bag to deal with minor injuries. As well as strapping tape if required.

Officials

Umpires – The division has organised for one referee to be present per match.

Coaches/Supervisors – Each school is to provide one coach for their team who should make themselves known to the convenor at the start of the day.

Timekeeper/scorer – Each team will be responsible for providing one person to be responsible for scoring and timekeeping. Digital timekeeping and scoring is available on all courts, a hard copy sheet will also be provided for each game and is to be kept along with the digital score.

First aid officer – A first aid officer will be present, but schools are encouraged to bring their own first aid supplies to deal with minor injuries.

Conditions of play

All sports are conducted under the School Sport Victoria's '[General Conditions of Competition](#)'

All players, teachers, spectators, and officials are bound by the '[SSV Codes of Conduct](#)'

Game lengths are 2 x 12minute halves with a 2minute half time interval, teams change direction at half time.

A maximum of two minutes can be added to the time, for an injury time out, to replace a player. This will be at the referee's discretion.

Netball is conducted under the rules of the All Australian Netball Association unless otherwise stated.

In accordance with Netball Victoria and SSV rules, rolling substitutions will be allowed during games. Teams should have two sets of bibs to facilitate rolling substitutions. Rolling substitutions must occur in the designated area. Only one (1) rolling substitute per team can be made at a time. However, it is required that these players must be ready to take the court so that no time is lost.

Multiple substitutions can take place during the interval.

A Boys/Mixed team must have a minimum of one boy on court for the entire game. A team that cannot field a minimum of one boy does not meet the Conditions of Competition and will be ineligible to receive points or awards and will not progress to the next level of competition.

If a team is late for the start of their match for reasons beyond their control and the team communicates with the convener, then the convener will try to accommodate the team as best he/she can. If a team is late without notice or communication or in the convener's opinion their lateness makes the draw impracticable, then they will be penalised 1 goal per minute they are late up to half time when they will forfeit the match. E.g.: If the match is 2x12 minute halves, the forfeit score is 12-0.

Playoff format

- A round robin tournament involving four teams.
- The team on top of the ladder after the conclusion of the round robin will progress to NMR level.
- At the conclusion of each game, teams will be awarded 4 points for a win, 2 points for a draw, and 0 points for a loss.
- If two teams are equal on points the winner from their head-to-head match will be declared the winner.
- If their face to face match was a draw, then total percentage from all their games will be used to determine the winner.
- If more than two teams are tied on points, percentage from the matches involving all teams will be calculated to determine the winner.
